Depression needs to be taken very seriously. If left unchecked it may get worse and can be potentially life threatening. Talking it over with someone who understands can make a big difference. But talking it over is just what depressed young men are unwilling to do.

Don't Die of Embarrassment is a powerful drama conceived and produced by Year 10 boys following an exploration into issues surrounding suicide in young men

The video can be used to support a structured programme related to mental health and emotional well being, and could be shown prior to a discussion on the importance of talking through worries and feelings.




